In those 'lost weeks' in Jerusalem, after that first Easter, the followers of Jesus had different experiences and different emotions varying from 'it is finished, lets give up' to 'he promised to be with us for ever' so lets WAIT! For them the waiting ending on Pentecost day, the birthday of the Church. For you the waiting 'in HOPE' may take a little longer but I AM CONVINCED THAT NOTHING IN THIS LIFE OR THE NEXT WILL EVER BE ABLE TO SEPARATE US FROM THE LOVE OF GOD IN JESUS CHRIST.

If you look again at the Acts 2 reading, put yourself in the story. Are you a doubter or afraid or disillusioned or questioning or a curious bystander or an interested observer or a scornful cynic or a transformed follower?

You will notice the verse where people could hear God's message in different tongues (languages – which is a theological reference to the tower of Babel) and even today God's message is shared in 'different voices'. For some it's the stories around messy church; for some it's the sermon or the hymns; for some it's the words of modern worship songs; for some its via a relationship built up from different aspects of the Church life and for some its through YOUR PERSONAL TESTIMONY (words and actions).

Be it spoken through 'wind or earthquake or fire or a dove or a still small voice or through nature or silence' God the Spirit Comes to Each STILL. If in doubt look again at the list of things in paragraph one to see where and how God in Jesus has sent his Spirit on his Church in this millennium.

To conclude however, having received the Spirit, Acts 2 tells us not to keep it to ourselves but be embolden by it, to move in the Spirit, to be the hands; feet; eyes; ears; mouth; heart and soul of Jesus Christ as you LIVE the Good News.

A PROFOUND INFLUENCE

There have been two Sutton ministers who have had a profound influence on my Christian life. The first helped bring me to a real understanding of what accepting the love of God means. The second allowed me to rediscover that love in our Church.

The first minister was, of course, Arnold Johnson. Since then several ministers have influenced me. David Mullins and Graham Jones during my time at Portobello and strangely, the American influence of the Greens and, later, Robyn at the church which I always felt was my home. But the second minister I referred to is a Lancastrian – namely Keith Borwick.

So why have I felt the need to publish these thoughts in the newsletter? Mainly because I am aware that Keith has often expressed his own worries about what he has achieved in these pages, so now is a good time to put his successes here

Anyone who has visited the amazing success that is Messy Church, or experienced the depth of fellowship that exists at the Thursday Fellowship or Wives and Friends, or seen how the young people have grown and matured and add so much to our church, or seen the people who have joined our church family in any capacity, or have shared in the social and entertainment events that are so vital to the growth of fellowship, or witnessed the range of involvement in our worship will understand what a vibrant place this is. We are a church that laughs and is happy to be together.

Now some may say that Keith isn't the leading presence in many of these features – but that, to me, is the strength of his ministry, and certainly the strength that has allowed me to ease back into involvement. Keith allows people to grow and to become involved. There are many people at Sutton whose energy, commitment and enthusiasm have enabled things to flourish under Keith's leadership because he allows people to develop their own ways.

Keith has enabled us to look differently at the way we think and work and the church is not the same as before he came. We have moved on. When I look round the congregation on a Sunday and see the variety of people, the range and depth of what they do or have done and the way that the variety of ages, interests and abilities blends together, then I understand why it was such a joy to come back, encouraged but never harassed by our minister.

Keith's family, too, have made such a difference to the life and atmosphere of the church and will leave a huge hole in the life of our church. Who will I tease about Preston now! For a minister's family to be so valued for who they are as individuals rather than their relationship to the minister has been a joy.

CIRCUIT YOUTH SERVICE – HEDON
